AVAN JOGIA

Ulysses

Avan Jogia has the lead role of Ulysses in the new STARZ Original series “Now Apocalypse.” In addition to the new independent feature *The New Romantic* for director Carly Stone, which premiered at SXSW earlier this year and was released by The Orchard, he starred in *Paper Year*, opposite Eve Hewson. Upcoming films are the New Line Cinema feature *Shaft*, opposite Samuel L. Jackson, for director Tim Story; and *The Artist’s Wife*, opposite Bruce Dern and Lena Olin. Prior credits include Bette Gordon’s *The Drowning*, alongside Julia Stiles and Josh Charles; the series “Ghost Wars” for Netflix opposite Vincent D’Onofrio; and the \$40 million epic miniseries “Tut” opposite Sir Ben Kingsley for Spike TV. Jogia played Puck in Shakespeare’s *A Midsummer Night’s Dream*, written and directed by Casey Wilder Mott, and he starred in *A Year of Spectacular Men* opposite Zoey Deutch. Both films were featured at the 2017 LA Film Festival. He also appeared in two independent films that were featured at Sundance: *I Am Michael*, opposite James Franco, and “10,000 Saints,” alongside Hailee Steinfeld, Ethan Hawke and Asa Butterfield.

Jogia has also directed his own short film, *Of Dogs and Men*, as well as the VFILES short series “Last Teenagers of the Apocalypse,” and he will direct his first full-length feature film, *Door Mouse*, next year. He was recently featured as one of the faces for the Kenzo fashion brand.

KELLI BURGLUND

Carly

California-native Kelli Berglund has quickly become “one to watch” in the entertainment industry, captivating audiences with the characters she has brought to life on the big and small screens. She stars as Carly in the new STARZ Original series “Now Apocalypse,” and she has a lead role opposite Jake Busey and Nikki Blonsky in the upcoming indie horror feature *Ghost in the Graveyard* (Cellar Door Films). She also has the lead in *Going for Gold*, directed and written by Clay Glen and produced by MarVista Entertainment. She previously worked with Glen in his gymnastics film *Raising the Bar*, which was recently released on Netflix. Additional recent television and film credits include starring as Willadeene Parton in NBC’s Emmy®-nominated *Dolly Parton’s Christmas of Many Colors: Circle of Love*, and a supporting role in the indie flick *1 Night*, opposite Anna Camp, Justin Chatwin and Isabelle Fuhrman.

Berglund may be best known for her lead role as Bree Davenport on Disney XD’s hit series “Lab Rats” and “Lab Rats: Elite Force.” She also starred in the Disney Channel Original Movie *How to Build a Better Boy*, opposite China Anne McClain, which also became a smash hit for the channel; NBC’s “The Night Shift”; Awesomeness TV’s “Love

An award-winning dancer, Berglund recently brought both her dancing and singing skills to the stage, starring as Belle in The Pasadena Playhouse's featured winter production "Beauty and the Beast: A Christmas Rose," produced by Lythgoe Family Panto.

BEAU MIRCHOFF

In addition to starring as Ford in the new STARZ Original series "Now Apocalypse," Beau Mirchoff's work experience includes five seasons as series regular Matty on the critically acclaimed MTV scripted series "Awkward." The New York Times named Mirchoff's Matty as "the most interesting character in the show." He also recently shot recurring roles on Showtime's "I'm Dying Up Here" and Freeform's "The Fosters." Mirchoff also appeared in a recurring role on NBC period drama "Aquarius."

Previously, Mirchoff gained attention on ABC's "Desperate Housewives" as series regular Danny Bolen (son of Drea de Matteo's character, Angie Bolen). His feature credits include Sony's *Flatliners* remake, *Scary Movie 4*, *The Grudge 3*, *I Am Number 4* and the gritty indie *Poker Night* opposite Ron Perlman, Giancarlo Esposito and Titus Welliver.

French/U.S. actress Roxane Mesquida stars as Severine in the new Starz series "Now Apocalypse." Before moving from France to the United States, Roxane Mesquida worked with such notable French film directors as Manuel Pradal, Catherine Breillat and Kim Chapiron. In addition to her role in *Kaboom*, she has appeared in the features *The Most Fun You Can Have Dying* by Kirstin Marcon, *Kiss of the Damned* by Alexandra Cassavetes (daughter of John Cassavetes) and *Homesick* by young independent filmmaker Frederic Da. She also played Beatrice, the sister of Louis Grimaldi in the TV series "Gossip Girl" and Betty Barnowski in "XIII: The Series." Upcoming films include *A Forgotten Place* and *Hallucinaut*.

TYLER POSEY

Tyler Posey recurs as Gabriel in the new STARZ Original series "Now Apocalypse." Previously, Posey played the lead character Scott McCall on "Teen Wolf," MTV's highest-rated and longest-running scripted show, which aired its 100th and final episode in September 2017. Currently, he recurs on the award-winning series "Jane the Virgin" as Jane's (Golden Globe®-winner Gina Rodriguez) first love, Adam. He recently joined the cast of MTV's "Scream: The TV Series" for its third season. Host of Teen Choice 2014 and the winner of multiple Teen Choice Awards for Choice Male Summer TV Star, Posey has also won an ALMA Award for Favorite TV Actor, and he was one of Variety's Power of Youth honorees for his work with the Leukemia & Lymphoma

Society. His other TV credits include Comedy Central's "Workaholics," ABC Family's "Lincoln Heights" and ABC's "Brothers & Sisters," as well as voicing Prince Alonso on Disney Channel's "Elena of Avalor."

Posey has begun to establish himself on the big screen as well. He recently starred opposite Lucy Hale in the Blumhouse thriller *Truth or Dare* (Universal Pictures), produced by Jason Blum. In 2016, he starred in Kevin Smith's feature comedy *Yoga Hosers*. In 2013, he co-starred in the cult spoof franchise *Scary Movie 5*, alongside Charlie Sheen and Molly Shannon, and in the indie film *White Frog*. His first films two films were *Maid in Manhattan* (as Jennifer Lopez's son) and *Collateral Damage*, alongside Arnold Schwarzenegger.

His breakout role was on "Better Man," in which he played the protagonist's (Remy Hii) arresting officer. He is known for his role as General Riga in Spike TV's "The Shannara Chronicles," as well as roles on "Neighbors," "Offspring," FOX's "Bones," NBC's "NCIS: Los Angeles" and the online series "Con Man." He also holds a Master's in Screenwriting from USC, which is ranked as the best film school in the world, and he has an option deal on his hour-long drama *It Don't Stop*.
